Horizon Europe legislation defines three types of impact tracked through Key Impact Pathways





How do we imagine societal impact to realise ?



NASA/DOD Technology Readiness Level



Actual system "flight proven" through successful mission operations

Actual system completed and "flight qualified" through test and demonstration (Ground or Flight)

System prototype demonstration in a space environment

System/subsystem model or prototype demonstration in a relevant environment (Ground or Space)

Component and/or breadboard validation in relevant environment

Component and/or breadboard validation in laboratory environment

Analytical and experimental critical function and/or characteristic proof-of-concept

Technology concept and/or application formulated

Basic principles observed and reported

Societal transformative innovation processes do not follow the logic of TRLs and are not restricted to product / service innovation (-> economic impact): There are more stakeholders interacting, innovation in governance, by community action (civil society) etc. -> How do we identify and formulate 'needs' and 'opportunities'?



The societal ,impact logic' from ,specific programme' to topic



Some well formulated "Topic-Outcomes"

For "Research and Innovation Action"

Policy-makers are provided with proposals for revised indoor air quality standards for the main determinants identified to support regulatory measures and improve regulatory monitoring.



For "Innovation Action"

European security practitioners benefit from better, modern and validated tools and training curricula on the use of travel intelligence to prevent, detect and investigate terrorism and other forms of serious crime.



Some hidden elements

Prescriptiveness & bottomup nature

- The outcome is derived from the expected impact as part of a larger portfolio of outcomes
- The outcome statement does rarely define outputs or methods to be used
- It is therefore **not prescriptive**
- Topics based on 'stakeholder needs' can hardly be 'bottom-up' – within the topic you find many opportunities for SSH

Exploitation & dissemination

- The outcome statement mentions the stakeholder group that would benefit
- That is an invitation to include this group
- Breaks with traditional 'dissemination and exploitation' – i.e. first produce the output and look then ('after the project'?) for its 'usability'
